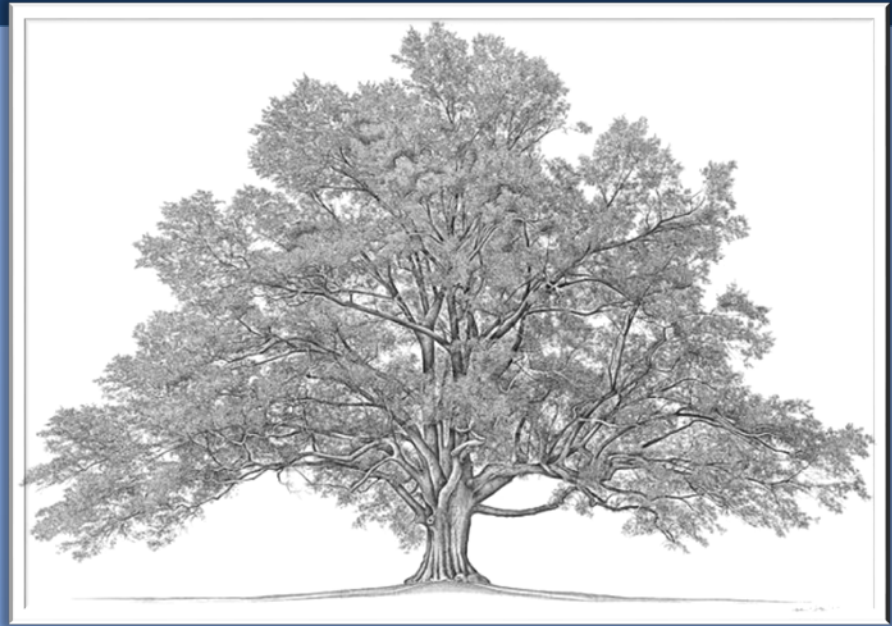

Family Narratives/Nation(alistic) Narratives bring together international scholars researching how family discourses intersect with national discourses, and the symbolic construction of the ideal family. Contributions include studies on international adoption of children; migration and diaspora; the reproduction of national ideals in children's education; normative femininity; and mother identities. These various topics are all explored using a lens of narrative analysis theory.
