


3. Courses - Study Programs

- PhD program (German or English)
- Master of Law UZH (mainly in German)
 International and Comparative Law (completely in English)
- Joint Degree Université de Lausanne
- Double Degree Master's Programs
 two semesters at UZH, two semester at the partner institution
 (either mainly in German or completely in English)
- Bachelor of Law UZH (in German)



3. Courses – Where and when do they take place?

- 1. Online Course Catalogue
- 2. Change language and semester in the upper right corner
- Enter the title of the module (search option), e.g. European Private Law
- 4. Click on the module title
- 5. Click on «Times/Rooms/Instructors», you can see where and when the course takes place.
- 6. Click on the room (e.g. «RAI-H-041») and then on the link (e.g. «RAI»)
 You will be directed to a <u>map</u>, <u>where the different University buildings are marked</u>, so you can easily find them.



3. Courses - Study Plan: Which modules can you choose?

- Regardless of your enrollment (BLaw or MLaw program):
 - All Bachelor modules offered at Faculty of Law UZH (not recommended for Master's students)
 - All Master modules offered at Faculty of Law UZH
- You may devise your study plan any way you see fit. No regulations defined by the Faculty of Law UZH:
 - No minimum number of ECTS credits
 - No module requirements
- We recommend 12 ECTS credits per semester as a minimum
- You are responsible for arranging your own lecture and examination schedule without any clashes.
- Modules offered by other faculties: Please contact the respective departmental coordinators directly. The Student Center cannot book modules from other faculties for you.

	Cancellation period until: 22.10.24 (24:00hrs)	
Space restricted modules (request and application modules)	Request period: 14.08. – 27.08.24 (24:00 hrs) Waiting list progression period: 30.08. (12:00hrs) – 12.09.24 (24:00hrs) Cancellation period: 30.08 (12:00hrs) – 15.09.24 (24:00hrs)



For module booking, the tiles with a red frame are relevant




Step 1: Select the desired modules by putting them on your list


Step 2: Booking Modules

By using the UZH symbol in the upper left you can get back to the student portal.

- Then click on






When a module is space-restricted, instead of the «Book Module» button, either «Request Module» or «Apply for Module»

The group can be changed during the booking period by clicking on «Courses» and then on «Change Courses»




Until the cancellation period ends, modules can be cancelled by clicking on the trash can icon



4. Module Booking: Mobility Exams

Mobility Exams are listed in the course catalogue under «Further courses»






In some cases, registration for a mobility exam does only include registration for the exam itself, but not for the lecture. In such cases, a module from this group has to be booked <u>in addtion</u>. Only bachelor modules thaught in German are affected by this. They have the category «Examination» instead of «Course» (see next slide).

4. Module Booking: Mobility Exams

If a mobility examination is offered for a module: You can either register for the mobility examination or the regular examination in the same module – not both



5. Exams - Assessments

- Two types of exams:
 - 1. Regular exams
 - 2. Mobility exams
- Module booking = examination registration
- Mobility exams are for exchange students of the Faculty of Law UZH only
- The final and exhaustive <u>list of mobility exams</u> in fall 2024
- No mobility exam → sit the regular exam
- Mobility exams cannot be accredited to a degree at the UZH
- Certain Master modules offer alternative assessment methods (e.g. written paper, presentations during the lecture period etc.):

- You have to book a module in the same semester in which you want to take the examination

5. Exams - Examination Periods Fall Semester 2024

- Mobility exams: 20 January 31 January 2025 (provisional dates/subject to change!)
 - mobility exams dates
- Regular exams: 06 January 31 January 2025 (provisional exam period/subject to change!)
 - regular exam dates MLaw
 - regular exam dates BLaw

The definite exam dates/times will be published 5 weeks after the module booking cancellation period, in the beginning of December 2024. Check the websites regularly for updates (last minute changes)

- It is possible that you have more than one exam on the same day!
- We strongly recommend you to keep yourselves available during the entire examination period.

5. Exams – General Information

- Ilness/absence exam deregistration: Only in case of illness or other compelling, unforeseeable reasons. Written request for
 deregistration must be submitted via student portal ("My Requests") at the latest within five working days after the exam. In the case
 of oral examinations, the relevant chair must also be informed prior to the examination.
 - → <u>Instructions</u>
- Permitted aids during exams: The permitted aids for each written exam are newly defined each semester and published on the websites of the respective semester.

At the end of an oral mobility examination the professor will tell you: passed or not passed, but not the grade.
