- 3) A review (750-1250 words) of one of the performances

Play Readings and Scene Work (hosted by advanced student Eva Feller)

- Group reading followed by short discussion about main themes and characters
- One scene from *Twelfth Night* to prepare in a group to be performed at the Shakespeare Birthplace Trust
- Highly recommended, especially the *Twelfth Night* session where groups will be formed, scenes allocated and rehearsal time scheduled
