





Timetable Considerations

- No more than 30 ECTS each semester
- Fewer ECTS if you are working as well
- Halve the ECTS for two-semester courses
- Check for mandatory modules (Pflichtkurse) in your minor in the spring
- Latin no longer mandatory but of course it is very helpful if you have it
 - → e.g. as Studium generale for students with 120 ECTS




Building PET (Pestalozzistr. 50), 8032 Zürich)
