- throughout: bleak colors? bright? varied?

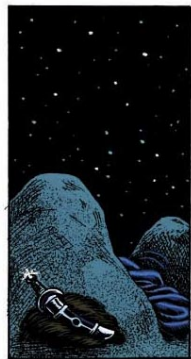


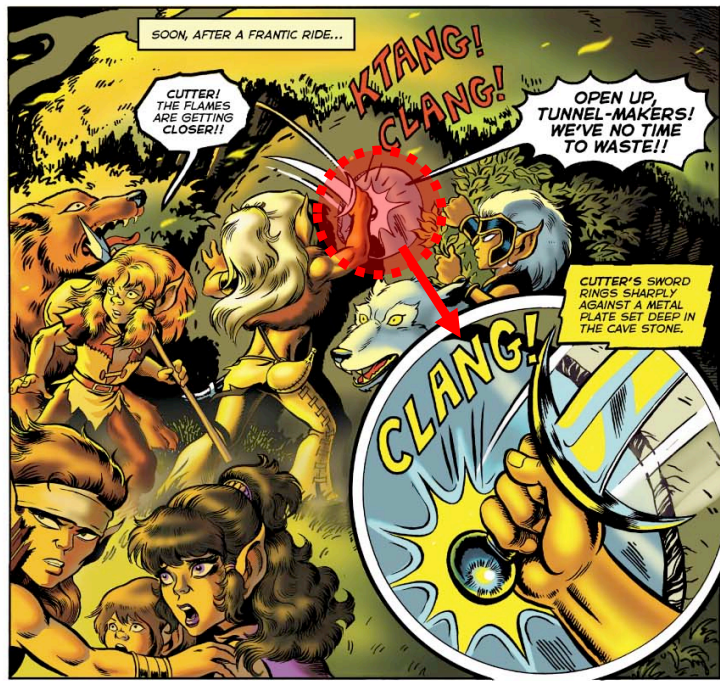

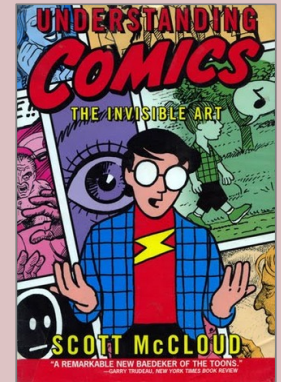
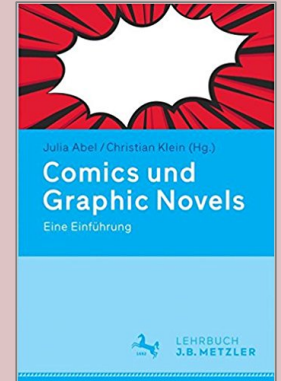
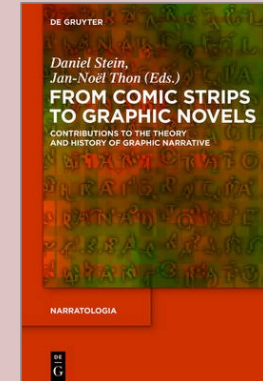


Other Teachable Primary Texts
