Over the last years China's economic development and its importance for the global economy and Switzerland are increasingly become the topical focus of our own economy. The impact of the shift in global forces and the COVID-pandemic are making us increasingly aware of the dependencies between China and other economic areas, especially Europe and the USA. In order to meet this need in the context of education, the Faculty of Law at the University of Zurich offers the lecture "Introduction to Chinese Business Law". In addition to an introduction to Chinese business law against the background of China's economic development, an overview of corporate law, commercial law and intellectual property law is given. The central topics in the areas of trade with and investment in China are dealt with and the economic, cultural and social backgrounds are shown. In addition to her academic qualifications, the lecturer, Dr. Esther Nägeli, has many years of practical experience in China projects and is currently a partner in a law firm specialising in this area.

The lecture is designed to provide an insight into practice beyond the requirements of legal studies and is also suitable for non-lawyers who deal with China projects in practice or for students from other faculties who are interested in China. Practical case studies will be used to highlight problem areas and solutions. The course is concluded by a case study which is based on real facts. Our guest speaker will discuss his company's experiences that they made with their investment in China.
