Susan Buck-Morss engages in the task of history-writing as a philosophical act. Together with the participants, she will discuss fragments of her new book, *Year One*, to be published in 2020.

Susan Buck-Morss, philosopher and intellectual historian, is Distinguished Professor of Political Science at the CUNY Graduate Center and Jan Brock Zubrow '77 Professor Emerita in the Government Department of Cornell University. Her work covers the fields of art history, architecture, comparative and German literature, cultural and visual studies, history and philosophy.

Her more recent publications include the influential books *Dreamworld and Catastrophe. The Passing of Mass Utopia in East and West* (2000), *Thinking Past Terror: Islamism and Critical Theory on the Left* (2003), *Hegel, Haiti, and Universal History* (2009), and *Revolution Today* (2019).
